

CRRF Open Access and Copyright Policy

The Canadian Rural Revitalization Foundation mandate holds that “knowledge and better understanding are the fundamental pillars for the welfare of rural communities and environments.” In keeping with this spirit, the CRRF Open Access Policy aims to improve the welfare of rural communities through the sharing of knowledge and research.

The CRRF Open Access Policy grants people full rights to reproduce, reuse and publicly present articles and materials published or presented through CRRF for non-profit purposes. Copyright for all presentations and materials presented at CRRF policy conferences, workshops, and events remains with the original author or presenter. CRRF will seek permission from each contributor to post their material(s) on the CRRF website to facilitate knowledge sharing, however, CRRF will not request transfer of copyright from the author of the material.

When contributors provide CRRF with permission to share materials the author retains the following rights:

Contributor’s Retention of Rights.¹ The author retains the right to (i) reproduce the article or presentation in any form; (ii) to perform or share the contribution in public; (iii) to convert the article or contribution by preparing derivative works; (iv) to make a sound recording, cinematographic film or other contrivance by means of which the article may be mechanically reproduced or performed; (v) to reproduce, adapt and publicly present the material as a cinematographic film; (vi) to communicate the work to the public by telecommunication; and (vii) to authorize others to make use of the article so long as author receives credit. For example, the contributor may make and distribute copies in the course of teaching and research and may post the article on personal or institutional web sites and in other open access digital repositories.

Authors who would like written confirmation of their retention of rights are encouraged to contact the President of CRRF. The President, in collaboration with the author, will sign a written agreement confirming the author’s retention of rights.

The purpose of this policy is to make the results of CRRF activities and publications accessible to everyone via the internet for non-commercial use.
