







Labrador-Grenfell Health Region

Strategic Issues: 2014-17

Issue 1: Population Health

• Goal: By March 31, 2017, Labrador-Grenfell Health will have implemented initiatives to achieve greater operational efficiency in the delivery of health care in the region.

• Goal: By March 31, 2017, Labrador-Grenfell Health will have improved client access to selected services in the region.




CSSS Basse Cote Nord

CSSS Basse Cote Nord

- Periodic consultations between administrations.
- Formal agreement for trauma services.
- Working on an agreement for reciprocal Laboratory testing services.
- Antenatal clients receive prenatal care from obstetrical team at CCMH and stay in St. Anthony prior to delivery date.





CSSS Basse Cote Nord

- Hereditary Non-Polyposis Colon Cancer (HNPCC)
 Screening Program at CCMH.
- Many surgical services at CCMH accessed by clients.
- Hostel services available in St. Anthony.
- Clients choose where they wish to receive primary services.




CSSS Basse de l'Hematite






Continued Collaboration in Labrador West
